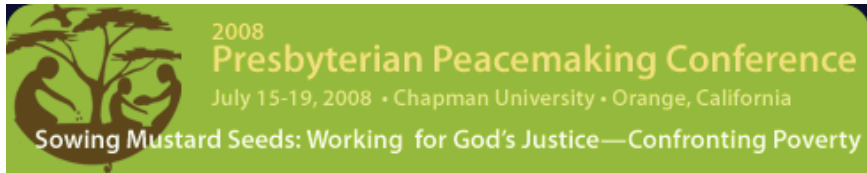

INFORMATION FOR SINGLE-DAY, WALK-IN ADULT PARTICIPANTS



The Single-Day Registration Rate (\$50/day) was designed just for commuters in the Southern California area. Even if you are able to join the conference participants for only a day your ideas and experience add to the overall experience for everyone. There is a place for you!

The Site: Chapman University, in Orange CA, is centrally located, near the 22 (Garden Grove) Freeway and is accessible via Amtrak/Metrolink, using Orange County's #59 bus. You could use <http://www.metro.net> to plan your route; for example, travel time from Union Station in Los Angeles to Chapman (Glassell Street/Walnut Avenue) takes just about an hour and costs \$7.25 (less for seniors). For San Diego commuters coming via Amtrak to the Irvine Station, the Orange County bus that passes the college is the same #59.

Included: This registration includes: the morning keynote, a segment entitled *Living the Story*, theological reflection, an afternoon workshop (first come first served), the evening intergenerational festival, and worship. Meals (and housing, of course) are not included. A complete schedule and more information about the Conference Leadership are included on the insert sheet that accompanies this flyer. Anuradha Mittal, executive director of The Oakland Institute and a native of India, is an internationally renowned expert on trade, development, human rights and agriculture.

Lisa Schirch is professor of peacebuilding at Eastern Mennonite University and program director of the 3D Security Initiative, which promotes conflict prevention and peacebuilding in U.S. security policymaking.

Mark Lomax is pastor of First African Presbyterian Church in Lithonia, GA, interim dean at Johnson C. Smith Theological Seminary and chair of the homiletics department at the Interdenominational Theological Seminary.

Cindy Edwards is a radio host, a guide for mountain biking and hiking tours and an avid backpacker from Baranof Island in Sitka, Alaska.
